Method - Place all the ingredients – except the butter – into a bowl and mix together.


Pour butter over the top and beat well for 3 minutes.



#### Lake Bolac & District Historical Society

The Sad Story of William 'Billy' Duncan

William John Duncan, known to all as Billy, was born on the 10<sup>th</sup> of January 1942. His parents were Lewis and Rita (nee Alsop) Duncan of Lake Bolac. Sadly, Rita passed away 12 days after giving birth to Billy. She was just 30 years of age and is buried at her home town of Mortlake. This left Billy to be raised by his father and grandmother Elizabeth (Lizzy) Duncan. This must have been a particularly difficult time as Lizzy was 70 years of age in 1942. Added to this Lew enlisted in the army in November '42, and wasn't discharged until 1946.

Billy was educated at the Lake Bolac State School and upon leaving school worked on district farms. While working as a rouseabout at a local shearing shed in 1961 Billy picked up a fleece and a splinter lodged under one of his finger nails. Although tetanus shots were available at the time Billy had not had one and tetanus (lockjaw) infection set in. Billy passed away on the 8<sup>th</sup> October 1961 at the age of 19 years.

The small Lake Bolac community was devastated by his passing. His death had a profound effect on his friends and was particularly felt by the congregation of the Lake Bolac Presbyterian Church. The Duncan family had a long association with the church. Billy's great-grandfather Lewis Duncan Snr arrived in Lake Bolac in 1856 as a cook for then storekeeper Cecil Louisson. He married and had 6 children including Lizzy. The family home was a small wooden cottage located at the southern end of the township across the road from the current P-12 College grounds. It was demolished in more recent times.

The cottage was used for Presbyterian services prior to the opening of the church in 1878. Lizzy was given a special gift by the church in 1958 to mark her 70 years of voluntary church cleaning. When she could no longer do the cleaning her son Lew took over the role.

Such was the respect for the Duncan family that on Billy's passing the fellow members of the P.F.A. (Presbyterian Fellowship Association) presented a bible to the church in Billy's memory. It had the P.F.A. crest on the front cover and an inscription inside. The bible was in use right up to the final service in the church in December 2023. The bible has been donated to the society and we are now the proud custodians of this small, but very meaningful piece of Lake Bolac's history.

Billy is buried in the Lake Bolac Cemetery with his grandmother Lizzy who died in 1964 aged 92. She

is remembered as being a lady of small stature. His father Lew is fondly remembered as a true gentleman in every sense of the word. He is also remembered for ending conversations with the sign off words, 'Thanks kindly'. In the early 1950's Lew moved a house from the O'Rorke property to the block of land where the Duncan cottage stood. This house was later beautifully renovated to become 'Pete's Place' B&B and is today a privately owned residence. Lew died in 1996 at the age of 84 and he is also buried in the Lake Bolac Cemetery.

#### FEBRUARY IN THE GARDEN

In February, there are fewer flowers on plants as most have put on their most lavish displays earlier this year, and are now covered with spent blooms. Some other plants such as Corymbias, Crepe Myrtles, Weigelas, Kangaroo paws, Daisies, and Roses are still flowering beautifully. In the garden, there is always lots to do, so here are the main points:

#### Planting and Watering

With the lower temperatures, you can put any plant in the ground safely without any risk of shocking or stunting them. Just make sure to water them generously and keep the soil moist, but not too wet. This is the best time for a large property and commercial landscape planting. As of mid-February, the rate of evaporation of water from the soil is less, so you can water your plants less frequently, or adjust your irrigation system accordingly.

#### Dead-heading and Pruning

After the beautiful first summer blooms, many of the flowering perennials are now covered with spent flowers, which are busy producing seeds inside. Some plants have a big flush of flowers at once, such as catmint, while others flower more consistently over the flowering period, such as daisies. The longer you leave spent blooms on the plant, the more resources or nutrients they utilise to produce seeds, and the plant will feel that it has completed its life cycle, i.e. producing seeds to ensure next generation. The best thing to do is remove spent blooms once the flower petals shrivel up. This will encourage more flowers to pop out. Very often the later summer blooms do not look as good as the earlier ones. You can give those plants a beautiful second late Summer-Autumn flush of flowers by doing some light pruning and removing all flowers, followed by an application of bloom-promoting fertilizer or seaweed solution, preferably by foliar application, and also applied around the root zone. Make sure to deadhead your Agapanthas early, to prevent them from going to seed, as they can get quite invasive.

#### **Fertilising**

Due to the frequent watering in summer, nutrients leach away from the soil, especially from pot and planters. Nitrogen or Nitrates are the most common nutrients that leach away along with other highly soluble minerals such as calcium. You may tend to notice discoloration or yellowing leave on your plants. The best way to prevent leaching is by top-dressing your soil with organic matter, compost, manure and encouraging microbial and fungal activity in the soil. Use slow-release fertilisers or seaweed solutions instead of traditional instant NPK ones. These take time to break down and give a steady supply of nutrients for a few months.

#### Pests and Disease

Warmer weather and humid conditions create the perfect mix for a host of pests and diseases for plants. Identify them early, treat them, and keep your plants healthy all through summer. Powdery mildew is one of the most commonly occurring plant problems at this time of the year. It is a fungal disease that affects plant leaves and stems, coating them in what looks like a white or grey powder-like substance. In severe cases, powdery mildew can even spread to the buds, flowers, and fruits of plants. A simple remedy is a good spray of the following mix: 1 tablespoon baking soda with 1 tablespoon vegetable oil and 1 teaspoon dish soap in 1 gallon of water. Another option is a mix of 1 part milk with 10 parts of water.

Lake Bolac's very own festival, the Eel Festival, is fast approaching,

Over Friday 22 March to Saturday 23 March this year, it includes a variety of activities to appeal to people of all ages and stages.

What's more, the festival's very reasonable entry prices have been kept the same as the last festival in 2022. See eelfestival.org.au to purchase.

The festival kicks off on the Friday night with an Art Auction in the town Memorial Hall. Talented regional artists are providing some 30 pieces to be auctioned at affordable prices. The cost to attend includes dinner by Castlemaine's Murnong Mammas served by RMIT students.

The Art Auction is a really fun night where you can also meet the artists involved as well as make new friends in the area.

The following day sees the festival proper kick off with a morning Welcome to Country followed by a day of impressive music performances, interesting workshops and information stalls with food stalls to keep you going into the night.

The music program includes the following talent: Brett Clarke, Seal Prince and the Roof Rats, Tim Scanlan, Bruce Watson, Skyglass, Gabby Steel Band, Andy Alberts Band and our very own local maverick songman, Neil Murray.

A key feature of the day is the Festival Forum which explores the festival theme: 'Song, Story, Dance: Ceremony and Celebration'.

The 2-hour forum will feature a presentation on Indigenous dance from musician and cultural warrior Brett Clarke; with respected Elder Aunty Adeline Thomas presenting the women's perspective.

Other talks include Freshwater Eels of Tasmania and the story of the eel life cycle by a ranger from the World Heritage Listed Budj Bim Cultural Landscape. Also presenting will be is Wergaia/Wamba Wamba Elder and Chair, Yoorrook Justice Commission, Prof. Eleanor Bourke AM. The commission is the first formal truth-telling process into historical and ongoing injustices experienced by Victorian First Peoples.

Beyond Bolac Catchment Action Group will update us on their local projects.

Workshops include indigenous basket weaving, eel-skin tanning and making botanical headbands.

Please note that billets are needed to accommodate musicians and presenters over the festival weekend. As well, volunteers are needed to help make the festival a success. A minimum of 4 hours before the festival or 2 hours on festival days will be rewarded with a free ticket to attend the festival proper.

#### **GRAMPIANS** 'Ride to Remember' – Sunday 4th February

The annual Ride is hosted by the Victoria Police Blue Ribbon Foundation – Ararat Branch and organised by a Sub Committee that includes branch members, Victoria Police together with a group of motorcycle enthusiasts, all local recreational riders who all want to make a contribution to their community.

The Ride Sub Committee led by Ararat Branch members, Dean Pinniger as Chairman and Snr Sgt Shaun Allen as the Victoria Police Forward Command together with Debbie Francis as Chief Marshal are committed to ensuring a safe and enjoyable ride for the expected 400 plus riders and pillions from across Victoria and SA who will descend on Ararat for this signature regional event.

The Ride is a green corridor event and under police escort to maximise safety and to minimise disruption to other road users. Experienced marshals together with vehicle and medical support will make up the contingent throughout the 190km ride route.

The Ride will start on the morning at 9am from the Queen/Barkly Streets roundabout adjacent to the Registration Area at Ararat RSL and travel the rural countryside down to the outskirts of Willaura then head onto Moyston and to Pomonal for the morning tea stopover at the Pomonal Hall. The Ride will then head to Lake Fyans and around to Lake Lonsdale before heading into the Grampians National Park through Halls Gap and up to Lake Bellfield before returning back via Halls Gap, Pomonal, Moyston and into Ararat for lunch at the Alexandra Gardens around 12.45pm.

The morning tea at Pomonal is being organised by the Pomonal Progress Association and up and running again Pomonal Tennis Club to raise funds for the tennis court upgrade and is being supported by their local community.

As per every year of the Ride, the Ararat Lions Club will be catering for the multitudes at the Alexandra Gardens. 
